### Jolie completes adoption process

Angelina Jolie arrived in Hanoi, Vietnam, on Monday to complete the procedures necessary to take her adopted son Pax Thien Jolie to his new home in the United States.

The 31-year-old actress dodged reporters on her way from the airport after flying from Ho Chi Minh City, where she adopted the newest member of her family at an orphanage on the outskirts of the city last week.

Jolie was expected to meet with U.S. Embassy officials today to apply for a visa for 3-year-old Pax. Once the visa is issued, she can take him to the United States. She was expected to leave Hanoi on Wednesday.

Jolie's oldest child, 5-year-old Maddox, who was adopted from Cambodia, came with her to Vietnam. She also has two daughters: Zahara, 2, who was adopted from Ethiopia, and 9-month-old, Shiloh, who was born to Jolie and her partner, Brad Pitt, in May.

Ever since she was young she has wanted to adopt children, Jolie said in an interview published Friday in a Vietnamese newspaper.

"Everyone would agree that children need to have a family," the paper quoted the Oscar-winning actress as saying. "I have the ability to help children fulfill that desire. Why should I say no?"

### Campbell goes to work

Naomi Campbell, wearing black stilettos and slinging dark work boots over her shoulder, traded the catwalk for community service Monday at a New York sanitation garage to start a five-day sentence for assaulting her maid.

The 36-year-old supermodel arrived at the Manhattan District 3 Garage at Pier 36 on the Hudson in a black sport utility vehicle. She'll be pushing a broom or mop at the garage for her guilty plea to misdemeanor assault for throwing a cell phone at her maid over a pair of missing jeans.

Campbell was met by a garage official who escorted her through the building's dirty, steel double doors. She also wore chocolate brown pants, a short fitted coat with a flared bottom, dark sunglasses and a newsboy-type cap over a short hairdo.

She didn't acknowledge the horde of assembled media.

"Miss Campbell arrived on time to work. She came ready to work," Albert Durrell, deputy chief of the Department of Sanitation, told reporters at a briefing outside the facility.

### Three-peat for Burke?

Cheryl Burke, two-time champion on ABC's "Dancing With the Stars," says she doesn't feel any pressure to bring home another disco-ball trophy as the fourth season premiered Monday.

Burke, who won with celebrity partners Drew Lachey and Emmitt Smith, tells People magazine's Web site: "I don't think it's pressure. Even after coming in last season after winning with Drew in the second season, it wasn't about, 'Oh, I have to win again.'"

Her new partner is "Beverly Hills, 90210" star Ian Ziering.

### Quick Bite

Jury selection began Monday in Los Angeles in the murder trial of legendary music producer Phil Spector – four

years after an actress who starred in a cult movie was shot to death in the foyer of his castle-like home. Jurors will be asked to decide if Spector was responsible for the death of Lana Clarkson, 40, who was shot in the face on Feb. 3, 2003. In an e-mail to friends, Spector, 66, called the death "an accidental suicide." Spector was present as the first members of a prospective jury pool of 300 people entered the downtown courtroom. He has pleaded not guilty and has been free on \$1 million bail since his arrest. If convicted, he could face life in prison.
